My mom was always into craft and to embellish the packages, she would make flowers and leaves with ribbons," says Surbhi.

Having learnt the art at home, Surbhi and Roohi decided to pursue it further. "We saved money to start our own venture. Initially, others thought that this was just a hobby for us. We had to really convince them and show our capa bility," she adds.

However, it's never easy learning the tricks of the trade.

Surbhi and Roohi had their own share of teething troubles. "Our artists are mostly based in Delhi from where my sister operates the business. Initially, Roohi would send me the stuff in cartons, but by the time they reached Pune, a lot of them would be broken. We had to find a solution. Finally, we found people who specialsied in gift dispatch and handling."

Narrating another incident, Surbhi says, "Once we were making invitation cards with shells for a wedding in Thailand. My sister dispatched the shells from Delhi and when they reached me the paint started peeling off from some of the shells. So I asked her to send me some paint to redo the shells. To expedite the process, she sent me spray paint, which didn't get customs clearance. I had to do everything from scratch all

in one night to complete the project and send the shipment to my client," shares Surbhi.

Now of course, things are in place. This mother of two says her business allows her a lot of flexibility to spend time with her family. "Even though my mom was a doctor she nev-er ignored us. I too try to work out the balance between work and family. I only work till five everyday so that I can spend my evenings with my kids," says Surbhi adding, "I enjoy my work further because I get to run the business with my sister. It seems less a task and more fun because of our partnership.
